FRONT DOOR SECURITY

To my fellow congregants:

As a part of maintaining a secure building at all times. especially when security personnel are not present (evening meetings and evening services), the front doors will no longer be open just prior to the start of a meeting or services. We will institute the policy below:

Commencing immediately, in order to gain access to the synagogue using the front entrance doors (again when there is no security personnel on site), everyone will be required to ring the video intercom button to the left of the doors. The doors will be unlocked by the remote control and you will be able to gain access to the building. For those requiring handicap access, an automatic door opener has been installed and the button is clearly marked. The right hand door will open by an automatic arm and close behind you.

In case inclement weather causes PJC to cancel in-person services, we will notify you at least one half hour before those services in the following ways:

- 1. An email will be sent;
- 2. A message will be posted on the PJC Facebook page;

In the event that the in-person services are canceled, we will still offer livestream services.

### FROM THE RABBI by Rabbi Steven Conn

There are two ways to learn history. One way is to memorize the facts. The other way is to relive the events. Memorization is the way many of us learned history in high school. Reliving the events is way we Jews have always learned our history.

The easiest way to the tell the Torah of Passover would be to read the first twelve chapters of the Book of Exodus. But the Passover Haggadah barely quotes from the Book of Exodus. Instead, we engage in a mixture of prayers, readings and rituals that help us experience for ourselves what it was like to be a slave in Egypt and what it was like to go free. At the beginning of our seders, we eat a green vegetable dipped in salt water. The saltwater, of course, symbolizes the tears of the Israelite slaves. Anyone who has ever swallowed their own tears will recognize the taste immediately. When we uncover the matzah after the four questions, we do not sing "Avadim haya avotaynu"-"Our ancestors were slaves." We sing "Avadim Hayinu"—"we were slaves." Similarly, when we sing Dayenu, we recount the story of the exodus, the forty years in the wilderness, the arrival in the land of Israel and event the building of the Temple in Jerusalem in the first person plural, as if these events happened to us personally. We eat matzah, the bread of affliction and the bread of freedom, just like our ancestors did. We experience a taste of the bitterness of slavery when we eat the *maror*, the bitter herbs. We also take time during our seder to explore how the experience of slavery in Egypt echoes in our own time, whether it is in the persistence of antisemitism, the oppression of religious and ethnic minorities or battle against modern day slavery, poverty and hunger. Seder nights are not just a time to remember the story of the exodus, but to live for at least a few moments as slaves in Egypt and then as newly free people.

Just days after Passover ends, we mark Yom Hashoah, Holocaust Remembrance Day. For a number of years now, I have been closely involved in creating our congregation's Yom HaShoah program. I have had to ask myself, "what does it mean for our community to remember the Holocaust?" Our program cannot just be a history lesson, at least not in the conventional way. It is not enough for us to just review the events of the Holocaust and commit the facts to memory. Knowing about the events of the Holocaust is important. Too many people are unfamiliar with even the basic facts. But as Jews, we need not only to know what happened to our people during the Holocaust, but also to re-experience some of the persecution and the suffering inflicted on European Jews. That is how Jews learn and preserve history. That is how we pass our history down to the next generation. And we need

to bring to light the persistence of root causes of the Holocaust, antisemitism, bigotry and hatred, in our own time.


For decades now, we have had Holocaust survivors who have helped us to understand what it was like to live through the horrors of the Holocaust. In recent years, many of their children and grandchildren have taken on the role of bearing witness. Through their stories, the story of the Holocaust becomes a part of our story as well. We are grateful for the willingness of our survivors and their families, as well as Holocaust scholars, to teach us the history of the Holocaust in a very Jewish way to share with us not just the facts of their experiences, but the feelings and emotions as well. In opening themselves to us, they have allowed us to experience a little of what they have experienced and to carry that experience with us as a part of who we are as Jews.

In many places in the world, we Jews must take full responsibility for making sure the events of the Holocaust are remembered and re-lived. We must be the ones to raise the alarm when antisemitism, bigotry and hatred flare up in our country and in the world. In our community, however, we are very fortunate. We have a strong partner in the Plainview Old Bethpage Central School District. New York State requires all school districts to teach their students about the Holocaust. Lessons about the Holocaust are woven into the K-12 curriculum, with a special emphasis in the upper grades. Our own Plainview Old Bethpage schools have embraced this mandate, going above and beyond what the State of New York requires. This year on Yom HaShoah, staff members from the Plainview Old Bethpage schools will share with us information about Holocaust education in our community and some of their own personal experiences in teaching the Holocaust to a very diverse group of students. They will also tell us about the school districts extensive efforts to teach about antisemitism and bigotry, both in connection with the Holocaust and also in contemporary life. The educators will describe the many ways, including incorporation survivors' testimonies, that they make Holocaust education come alive and touch not only the minds but also hearts of all of our students.

On Yom HaShoah, we will acknowledge these dedicated educators and express our gratitude for the important work they do. We will also take some time to acknowledge and honor two very accomplished Holocaust educators in our own congregation: Zelda Polofsky and Jud Newborn. Both Zelda and Jud have devoted much of their lives to teaching about the Holocaust. With their passion for teaching and their willingness to go outside the Jewish community to bring the stories of the Holo<u>From The Rabbi</u> (continued from Page 6)

As the month of March flew by with lots of Purim shpils, music and fun projects, now it is time for families to start making preparations for the Passover seders. I want to wish you a very joyous Passover, in good health and spirits!

In the Haggadah (book that is read at the Passover seder), it is stated that every type of child is present at the Passover seder meal: the wise son, the wicked/rebellious son, the simple son, and the son who doesn't even know how to ask questions. We are instructed to teach each of these 4 'sons' about the story of Passover in a way that is geared towards his personality.

On Passover we recognize that no two people are alike and we must be there for everyone according to their own level. This is a fundamental basis for education, as King Solomon said in Proverbs: "Educate a child according to his way; even when he grows old, he will not turn away from it."

The goal of education is not merely to transmit information, but to mold the student's character, and to set their feet on a path which they can follow throughout their lives.

This is the driving force that our educators follow on a daily basis at Plainview Jewish Center Hebrew School. It is important that we not just teach children academics, rather we must convey to them important moral values as well.

Purchases by credit cards for this special program cannot be applied. This will not affect the payment of the balance of your dues or other balances for which credit card payments will continue to be accepted.

Gift Cards can still be purchased by credit card. However those credit card purchases will not be applied to reduce your financial obligations.

If you have already fulfilled your financial obligations for the current year, you can still take advantage of this new Voluntary Financial Obligation Offset Gift Card Purchase Program by purchasing the gift cards and having the applicable amount reduce your future obligations. Additionally, I am delighted to announce that there has been no limit placed on this program. Buy as many or as few Gift Cards as you like. Only when they know can they mobilize our Bikur Cholim committee to provide additional support. Don't worry that they might already have the information. Don't worry that you are "bothering" these busy people. The information you provide will be vital to helping our congregation to serve the needs of those who need us the most.
